About Abrigo Centre:

Abrigo Centre is a non-profit organization serving Toronto's Portuguese-speaking and multicultural communities. We empower individuals and families through culturally sensitive services and support systems, promoting social inclusion and community well-being.

Position Overview:

Abrigo Centre is seeking a **Community Development Worker for an 8-week summer position** funded through the Federal Government's **Canada Summer Jobs program**. Eligible participants must be between 15 and 30 years of age (inclusive) at the start of employment; Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or persons to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*.

The successful candidate will gain hands-on experience promoting equity and addressing barriers that community members face, including poverty, settlement challenges, domestic violence, mental health and substance use issues, and more. You will work within a supportive, anti-oppressive, client-centered, and trauma-informed environment.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct a community needs assessment
- Develop an inventory of local services and resources
- Work with small groups or individual clients to assess needs and develop service plans
- Design and deliver short information sessions and workshops (e.g., government benefits, services, family violence dynamics)
- Support clients with goal-setting and accessing services such as subsidized housing, financial assistance, and pensions
- Provide interpretation and translation support in Portuguese and English
- Liaise with service providers to advocate for community needs
- Maintain and update client records in the organization's database
- Assist the Program Manager with research and evaluation initiatives
- Participate in staff meetings and community events as required

Qualifications:

- Fluency in Portuguese and English is required
- Strong interpersonal skills and a passion for working with diverse communities
- Knowledge of social services and issues affecting immigrant and low-income communities is an asset
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively in a team setting
- Commitment to anti-oppressive, client-centered, and trauma-informed practice
- An understanding of anti-racism, anti-oppression, social justice and trauma informed practice
